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Saving my Reflections Workbook

How to Save

- 1) Download the ESN Reflections Workbook to your desktop and open it with Adobe Acrobat
 - a) If the PDF opened in Google Chrome, click the download arrow button on the top right corner of the page beside the 'rotate' and 'printer' icon
- 2) Save As/Rename the file to: [Last name of ESN]_ESN Reflections (save this on your desktop for easy access)
- 3) Open up the PDF document you just saved on your desktop in Adobe Reader and start working on the questions. When you're done, save again. The file name should remain the same
